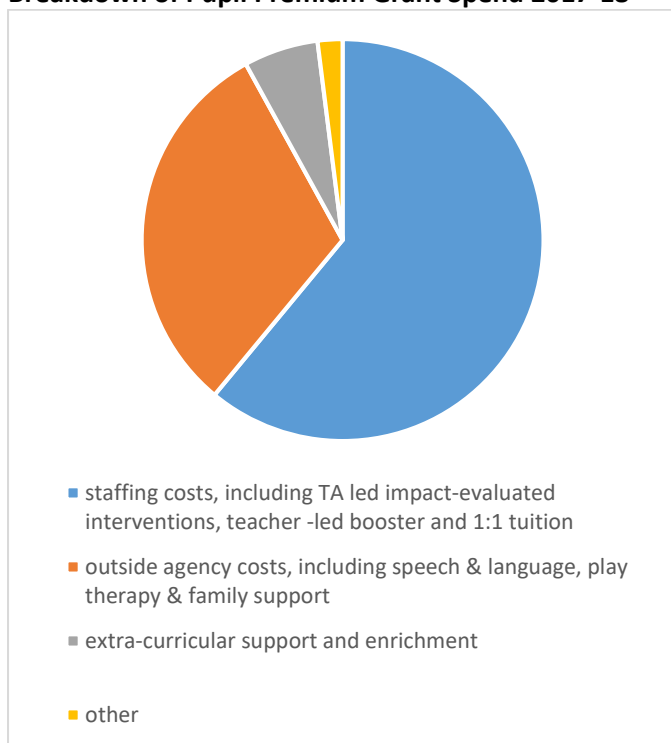
### Summary of main barriers to learning

These are broad and wide-ranging but generally include:

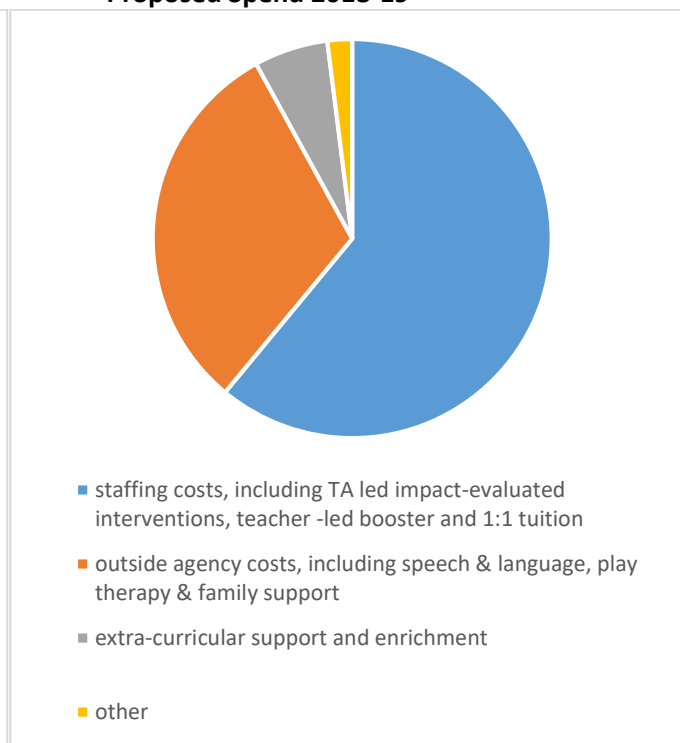
- Low language levels
- Broken family structures – family stress and low resilience
- Low parental engagement/parenting skills
- Safeguarding and welfare issues which may lead to Social Services involvement
- Loss and bereavement
- Trauma and other mental health issues in the family and/or child
- Frequent moves of country and school
- Socio-economic disadvantage i.e. poverty
- Housing issues i.e. overcrowding, temporary poor quality accommodation and friction with neighbours and other members of the community
- Poor health and diet, high level of medical needs, and low attendance
- Special educational needs and disabilities.

Due to our relatively low numbers, we are able to tailor our support accordingly.

Our reasons for this approach to spending the pupil premium are simply that we believe this is the best way to ensure our children have the best chance of success in life and are suitably 'secondary ready'. Although we have several impact measures, including pupil and parents feedback, pupil progress, life experiences and curriculum enrichment, our key impact measure is end of KS2 attainment.
